



**CDV** – Original bust view CDV of **Peleg R. Irwin** who mustered into Co I of the 2nd Mass Cavalry as a 30 year old clerk. Entering the service as a private, he was promoted through the ranks, and was commissioned a Lieutenant on Jan 1, 1864. Irwin survived the war and mustered out July 20, 1865. CDV is very fine condition with clean corners, pen signature on verso, “P. Ren Irwin/1<sup>st</sup> Lieut and Regt Com’sy/2” Mass Cav” with Brady backmark. #496. **SOLD**



**CDV** – Benjamin F. Partridge of Stockton, Maine. As a 26 year old sailor, he enlisted in California with the Cal Battalion and mustered into Co. E on February 5, 1863. Promoted to sergeant, and then through the officers ranks, Partridge ultimately reached the rank of Captain. He survived the war. An identical image was identified in Wesley Howe’ album, this one is blank. Collection #495. **\$400**



**CDV** – **William S. Wells**. Original bust view CDV of William S. Wells of Company H, 2nd Mass Cavalry. Wells mustered in at the age of 29 on December 8, 1862. On July 29, 1863 he died of typhoid fever. Pen identification on verso. Backmark J. D. Wells, No. 6 Merchants Row, Northampton, Mass. Collection #497. **SOLD**



**CDV** – Original standing view CDV of **Pvt. Martin Ford**, Co. D, 2nd Massachusetts Cavalry. Ford enlisted as a 27 year-old tailor from Lawrence, Rhode Island on January 13, 1863. Ford survived the war and mustered out on July 6, 1865. CDV is in good condition with Mason & Gardner backmark. Corners have been trimmed and CDV is lacking in contrast with foxing along background, one area of loss on right margin, not effecting image. Collection #498. **\$200**



**CDV** - Original and signed CDV of Bugler **Alfred F. Lee**, Company A, 2nd Mass Cav. Lee, originally from Newburyport, Massachusetts, enlisted with the Cal Hundred on November 30, 1862 in California. He was a 23 year old blacksmith. Lee died while the regiment was camped at Vienna, Virginia on April 7, 1864, of "brain disease." The CDV is in overall very fine condition although slightly faded. Lee is standing with his forage cap resting on a chair. The cap bears the insignia of the crossed sabers and "Cal 100" at the top. The back is blank with faint remains of Lee's ink signature and sentiment, "Compliments of Alfred F. Lee, Cal 100." Collection #499. **SOLD**
