



**CDV** — Robert M. Parker of San Francisco. At the age of 33, Parker enlisted as a private on November 4, 1862 with the Cal Hundred. He rose to the rank of corporal. On May 4, 1864 he was discharged for promotion as a Lieutenant with the 5<sup>th</sup> Massachusetts Cavalry, a unit composed of free blacks. Parker survived the war and remained in the East. Image is slightly faded, pen id by Wesley Howe as Capt. Parker. In Parker's hand at bottom margin is Lieut. Parker Squadron M. On back in very fine script is "Resp. Yours, one of Sheridan's Raiders." **CDV** – Benjamin F. Partridge of Stockton, Maine. As a 26 year old sailor, he enlisted in California with the Cal Battalion and mustered into Co. E on February 5, 1863. Promoted to sergeant, and then through the officers ranks, Partridge ultimately reached the rank of Captain. He survived the war. This image bears a Massachusetts backmark and may have been made at war's end after the regiment mustered out. Identified by Wesley Howe in period ink on the lower margin, "Capt Partridge Squadron K." Collection #595. **\$500**



**CDV** – Lewis Poulson of Company K, 2<sup>nd</sup> Mass Cavalry. Poulson was originally from Salem, Massachusetts and was a seaman. He enlisted at the age of 28 into the U.S. Navy, but was discharged after a year, on July 31, 1862. That December he enlisted with the 2<sup>nd</sup> Massachusetts Cavalry where he survived the war. Poulson's image was contained in an album assembled by Wesley C. Howe who identified him in ink on the face of the CDV as "Poulson." On the reverse in period ink is "Poulson, Co. M." Collection #596. **\$250**



**CDV** – seated view of Frederick J. Quant who enlisted as a private with the Cal Hundred in San Francisco on October 30, 1862. Quant was promoted to corporal and subsequently reduced to the ranks as private again. He was taller than most of the men of the regiment and played in the regimental band. This CDV was held in the Wesley C. Howe album and is identified by Howe's script as H. Quantlow (a nickname?). Brady backmark with "H. Quantlow, Regt. Band" also in Howe's hand on back. #597 **\$250**



**CDV** – Standing view of Amos Ryley who was originally from Mystic Bridge, Connecticut. On March 19, 1863 he enlisted with the Cal Battalion in California and mustered into Company M. Ryley was captured at Middletown, VA on August 13, 1864 and was paroled on February 22, 1865. He was promoted to the rank of corporal, date unknown. This image was held in Wesley C. Howe's album and bears Howe's id on the front of the image. Collection #598. **\$400**
