



**CDV** — Alvin W. Stone, 2<sup>nd</sup> Mass Cavalry. Stone enlisted with Company M of the Cal Battalion in San Francisco on February 13, 1863. He resigned on September 8, 1864. Image is slightly faded, pen id by Wesley Howe as Capt. A. W. Stone. Stone's signature is on back as Lieutenant Stone with Worcester, Mass backmark. Collection #599 **\$400**



**CDV** – Joseph B. Varnum, 37 year old miner from California who enlisted with the Cal Battalion on March 20, 1863. Mustered into what became Co. M, he was killed during a skirmish with Mosby at Coyle's Tavern, Virginia on August 24, 1863, shortly after being promoted to the rank of sergeant. This image is extraordinary in that it bears the San Francisco backmark of W. M. Shew photographer. Varnum is pictured with uniform and accouterments so new that the folds in his trousers are still fresh. On his forage cap is the brass "C" for Company C which was resolved into Company M when the men arrived in Massachusetts. Nice sharpness and contrast, and untrimmed. **CDV** – Isaac S. Warner, a private in Company M of the Cal Battalion, 2<sup>nd</sup> Mass Cavalry. Warner who was originally from Boston, enlisted as a 25 year old miner in the Bay Area. He was promoted to Sergeant and mustered out with the regiment on July 20, 1865. Identified by Wesley C. Howe from whose album it came. The image is slightly soft and is likely a period copy of another CDV. It bears a Boston backmark of photographer T. R. Burnham. Collection #601. **\$350**



**CDV** – seated view of David Watson, a 31 year old tailor from New Lisbon, Ohio. He enlisted in California with Company M of the Cal Battalion as a private on January 30, 1863. He survived the war. The image is identified in Wesley C. Howe's hand as "Sergt Watson". In Watson's own hand on the bottom margin is "Watson of Co M, fighting M." Salem, Ohio backmark indicates that this image may have been made at war's end when Watson returned to his home state. Collection #602 **\$400**



**CDV** – Bust vignette view of regimental bugler, Peter White. Image is faded, as are others of White's known CDVs, likely due to photo processing. Identified by Wesley C. Howe on the front as "Pete" the Bugler. In White's own hand on bottom margin is "Peter" and "Regimental Bugler." No backmark. Collection #603. **\$200**
