



CDV — Vignette bust view of Wesley C. Howe of the 2nd Massachusetts Cavalry. Originally from Shippensville, Pennsylvania, Howe enlisted as a Sergeant in Company M of the Cal Battalion on March 20, 1863 in San Francisco. Promoted 1st Sergeant, then on March 25, 1864 commissioned as a Lieutenant. Captured on September 19, 1864 and spent the winter in Confederate prison camps, paroled February 23, 1865. Howe assembled an album of CDVs after the war which included a number of troopers from Company M. This image was one of four of Howe. #584. **SOLD**



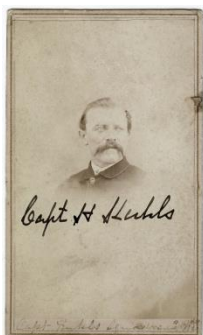
CDV – Originally from Liverpool, England, John Hughes enlisted in California with Company M of the 2nd Mass Cavalry as a private. He transferred out in May 1864 to the U.S. Navy and served on the USS Princeton and the USS Shenandoah, reaching the rank of seaman. Hughes deserted at Havana, Cuba on November 1, 1864. This image was held in the Howe album. Collection #585. **\$250**



CDV – Vignette view of Peleg R. Irwin, a 30 year old clerk who enlisted on February 9, 1863 with Company I of the 2nd Massachusetts Cavalry. During the war, he was promoted to Sergeant Major on November 29, 1863 and then as 1st Lieutenant & Commissary of Subsistence on January 1, 1864. Irwin survived the war and mustered out with the regiment at Fairfax Court House on July 20, 1865. This image in the Howe album and is identified in Howe's hand twice on the front. The reverse bears the notation "Lt. Irwin of California" in a different hand, presumably Irwin's. #586 **\$300**



CDV – ¾ seated view of Isaac B. Jordan of Boston as a Sergeant. As a 28 year old carpenter, he enlisted on March 15, 1864 as a private in Company G of the 2nd Massachusetts Cavalry. He was promoted during the war to the ranks of 1st Sergeant (6 Apr 1865) and 2nd Lieutenant (09 Jul 1865). Identified by Wesley Howe on the front, it also bears the notation on the bottom margin "Sergeant Jordan Squadron K" presumably in Jordan's hand. Proctor's Room, Boston backmark. CDV – Vignette portrait view of Henry Kuhls of the 2nd Massachusetts Cavalry. Kuhls was a 30 year old miner who enlisted in San Francisco with Co. L of the Cal Battalion on January 27, 1863. Kuhls was promoted to Lieutenant on 05 Feb 1864, as 1st Lieutenant on 25 Mar 1864, and then as Captain on 31 Aug 1864. He was severely wounded at Cedar Creek on October 19, 1864. Recovering, he returned to the regiment and was captured in the closing action of the war at White Oak Road, Virginia on March 30, 1865. He was paroled on 04 Apr 1865. Identified by Wesley Howe on the face, it bears a backmark WM. L. BROTZMAN, Washington N. J. Collection #588. **\$250**
