Early war sixth plate tintype of a young private who is a member of the 65th New York Infantry otherwise known as the 1st US Chasseurs. This soldier is dressed in the distinctive uniform worn by that unit which includes a light blue piping outline on the collar and button fall, with functional shoulder straps which are also outlined with piping. His cap rests in his lap with the pom-pom slightly visible. This regiment was present at every major battle of the Army of the Potomac, amounting to nearly 30 engagements.

It is housed in minty sixth plate thermoplastic union case, the corners are sharp with minimal nicks. The hinges are tight and the case closes easily. The plush is near mint burgundy velvet with no blemishes. This case is Krainik's #204 "Wildflower" and is listed under rarity as "scarce."
